Through the current school holidays, our capable community development team have embraced Youth Week in collaboration with the Recreation Centre and are organising a range of free youth activities. As the road programme and reconstruction begins to draw to a close, the crew have relocated out to Coronation Road to work on straightening out one of the bends. Roads that have had some attention this year have included Nanga Brook Rd to the Far North East of the Shire to Johnston Rd to the west. Maintaining and rebuilding roads forms a significant part of the Council budget and remains a very important function of Local Government. There has been a significant increase associated with the costs of road construction and this has been matched with strong advocacy for

increases in road funding from State and Federal sources.

Continuing the tradition of Anzac Day this year, our Council with the support of some community groups will be organising the Dawn Service at 6:15am and the traditional March starting at 10:45am from the Memorial Hall leading to the Service at 11am at the Waroona War Memorial. A Gunfire Breakfast will be provided by the Lions Club in the Memorial Hall after the Dawn Service and the Bowling Club will host a function at midday after the 11am service. I encourage all who can to attend this national day of respect and reflection.

This year is an election year for Local Government. If you have a passion

for your community and would like to step up to take on a role of a Local Government Councillor, there will be information coming out in the next few months on what the requirements are and what the responsibilities are.

A good way to see first hand what a Councillor's role involves is to attend a Council meeting. Local Government is very diverse and can lead to areas that can be challenging but also rewarding. 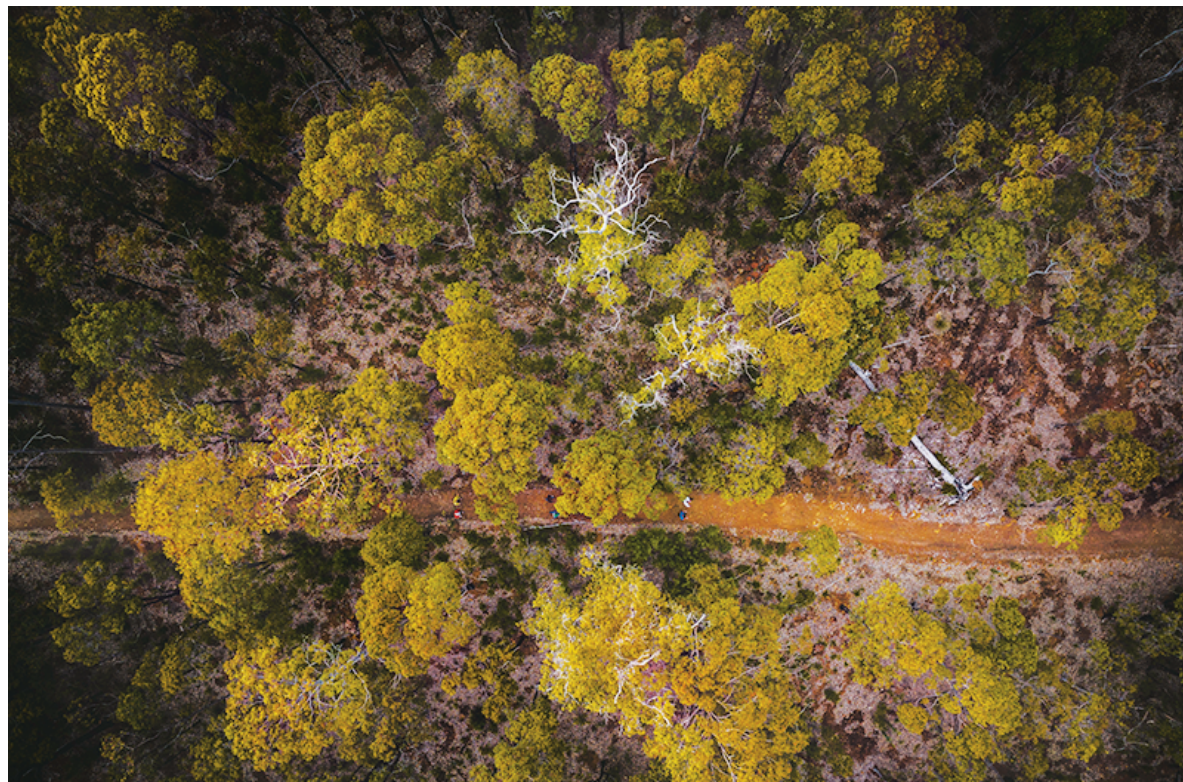

Update on Rio Tinto's plans to explore and mine in the southwest of Western Australia

The Shire of Waroona has received correspondence in response to a request for Ministerial intervention to terminate applications for exploration licenses made by Rio Tinto. However, the Minister's intervention is believed not to be appropriate at this time. The Minister did note however, that should Rio Tinto identify a resource that it wishes to mine, it will need to mark-out and lodge an application for a mining lease(s). A mining lease application can be objected to in the same way that objections may be lodged to an exploration license application.

To reiterate the Shire's and community's concerns, an exploration license could allow Rio Tinto to conduct exploration activities, with access to the only Northern Jarrah Forest in existence and Waroona's water catchment locations.



Exploration activities can include constructing many kilometers of access roads through the forest, clearing significantly sized areas of the forest to set up of

exploration camps, drilling for and extracting water from the catchment, as well as extracting 1000m3 of material without a mining permit being needed.

To conserve the forest's biodiversity and the region's water catchments, the Shire of Waroona is asking the regulatory bodies involved to either terminate the exploration

applications or restrict the types of exploration locations and activities allowed. The Northern Jarrah Forest is a biodiversity hotspot which rivals the world's tropical rainforests and is home to all three species of Black Cockatoos and other rare flora and fauna.

It should also be noted that if lithium and/or nickel mining were to occur in the Northern Jarrah Forest, it could potentially result in several mine pits up to 2km across and at a depth well below the level required for bauxite. The lithium mine at Greenbushes WA is an example of this type of mine. At present in WA, mining companies are not required to backfill mine pits.

The Shire will continue to monitor and inform the community on this matter.

Anzac Day Commemorations in Waroona

The community is invited to join all Service and Ex-Service Personnel at ANZAC Day commemorations within the Shire of Waroona.

Commencing at 6.15am on 25 April 2023, a Dawn Service will be held at the Waroona War Memorial, located on the corner of South Western Highway and Parnell Street in Waroona.

The Dawn Service will be followed by a Gunfire Breakfast at the Waroona Memorial Hall. The breakfast will be prepared

and cooked by the Waroona Lions and is offered free-of-charge to all residents who wish to enjoy camaraderie with the Veteran community.

At 10.45am, the ANZAC Day Parade commences from the Waroona Memorial Hall to the Waroona War Memorial. The Service March is open to all Service and Ex-Service Personnel and will be accompanied by the WA 10th Light Horse Organisation (Harvey Troop). Traffic on South Western Highway will be closed



from 10.30am to 12pm to allow the commemorations to proceed with respect and safety.

Once assembled at the Waroona

War Memorial, the ANZAC Day Service will commence from approximately 11am.

Local Government Act 1995 Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act 2007 Shire of Waroona Proposed Pest Plant Local Law 2023

The Shire of Waroona proposes to make a local law relating to pest plant related matters.

The **purpose** of this Local Law is to allow Council to determine pest plants by absolute majority, provide a framework for effective pest plant control, and a means to enforce removal of pest plants from Shire and private land.

The **effect** of the proposed Shire of Waroona Pest Plant Local Law 2023 is that owners and occupiers of land within the district are to comply with the provisions of this local law.

A copy of the proposed local law may be inspected at or obtained from the Shire's office at 52 Hesse Street, Waroona, between 8.30am and 4.00pm Monday to Friday. A copy is also on the Shire's website www.waroona.wa.gov.au.
