WAROONA MAIN STREET DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS

Given that a section of Waroona's main street has proved to be susceptible to flooding during heavy rain, Council has accepted a proposal to mitigate the risk of this flooding occurring in the future. Understandably, the businesses that are impacted by these flooding events and the obvious negative ramifications are very keen to see a resolution to the problem. Obviously, one of our greatest fears is that in the likely event of a significant rainfall, the resultant property damage has the potential to be substantial.

Some of the issues that need to be overcome are:

- · Lack of drainage capacity both upstream on Thatcher Street and in the section of the main street drainage itself
- · Low kerb profile along the subject section

 Incorrect slope of footpath which falls towards the properties rather than awav

It is obvious that this remedial work will present some significant challenge and as such should be seen as "stage one" of a larger strategy that will be required to address the issues posed by Thatcher Street both in this location and in others. The harsh reality is of course, that retrofitting underground drainage is a complex and expensive issue.

FERGUSON ENQUIRY REPORT

The Shire of Waroona has provided a submission to the Ferguson Enquiry Report Review Group urging State Government to adopt recommendations of the Ferguson Report. The Shire fully supports the implementation of an independent Rural/Bushfire Service (separate from DFES) whose role is to provide funding and support to Local Governments and their Bushfire Brigades to support the community. We strongly recommend Government undertake major policy reforms that allow flexibility in service delivery, based on local risks that enable mitigation and prevention activities to be carried out at the local level. We also expressed the view that our volunteers be given the due recognition they deserve for their excellent work and commitment. We see the report as a positive opportunity to make significant change that will help rural communities deal with the increasing devastation of large scale disasters and as such we fully support the Ferguson Report.

FIRE BRIGADE AGM

During the month of August, I, along with Waroona Chief Bush Fire Control Officer, John Twaddle, attended the AGM of the Preston Beach Volunteer Bushfire Brigade. On behalf of the Shire and community I thanked the Brigade for their outstanding contribution during the horrendous fires in January. John also thanked everyone for their hard working efforts; not only during the fires, but also their commitment to training. During the course of the meeting a raft of issues were discussed, including local area fire mitigation concerns, evacuation plans and the possibility of a warning siren for the town site of Preston Beach. Some of these items are to be referred to our Local Emergency Management group for consideration.

The election results saw Steve Thomas elected as Brigade Captain, Don Bebbington as 1st Lieut., Clint Vagg 2nd Lieut and Terry Pilbeam elected as Secretary. Membership numbers for the Brigade currently stand at 16.

At Lake Clifton, the good news is the new Fire Station is well on the way to being completed with a projected completion time of mid-October and the official opening to be around mid-November.



PEEL DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION - ROYALTIES FOR REGIONS FORUM

On Friday, the 26th of August, representatives from Peel Development Commission presented a forum on the Royalties for Regions grants at the Waroona Community Resource Centre. The representatives provided a slideshow with information on the guidelines and application process for the Community Chest Fund and Regional Grants Scheme. The forum was well attended by a number of enthusiastic local community groups and organisations to find out if their projects are eligible for the funding. The Community Chest Fund comprises of one-off grants up to and including \$50,000 to support small, local demand driven community projects throughout the year, with applications closing on September 16. The Regional Grants Scheme comprises of grants from \$50,000 to \$300,000 to improve economic and community infrastructure and services in regional Western Australia, with applications closing on September 23.

The Advisory Committee will be responsible for administering up the Alcoa Waroona Sustainability Fund (AWSF). The Committee will have the responsibility of developing guidelines for grants and making recommendations for successful grants to the Shire of Waroona for final approval.

A guiding principle of the fund is that the fund is to be used for one-off, innovative, larger community development type projects that make a net position contribution to the sustainability of the region surrounding the Wagerup refinery, with a focus on the areas of Waroona, Lake Clifton, Preston Beach, Nanga Brook, Wagerup and Hamel.
