### LAKE CLIFTON FIRE BRIGADE BUILDING OPENING

I recently had the honour of officially opening the new Fire Brigade building at Lake Clifton. Executive staff and Councillors joined with representatives from the Department of Fire & Emergency Services (DFES) and members of the Waroona, Waroona West, Lake Clifton and Preston Beach volunteer fire brigades to celebrate this special event. I took the opportunity to thank DFES for their ongoing support for this project and also acknowledged our co-ordinator of corporate planning, John Crothers, for his hard work and persistence throughout this project. I am on record of saying that I believe that volunteers are quite often the heart beat or the pulse of a strong community and the Lake Clifton Fire Brigade are a prime example of that. We only have to look back over the past six years and you will see that this group has been involved in many serious major events. In 2011 we had that catastrophic fire that swept through this Lake Clifton area, then in 2015 we had the major fire in Waroona,

followed by that horrendous fire in 2016. On each occasion the Lake Clifton brigade played a significant role joining with other brigades in protecting our community.

For me personally, I can go back some 18yrs ago when I first joined Council and I can remember attending community meetings in what was then the original Lake Clifton fire shed and sharing the building with some of the biggest mozzies I have ever seen. From the Shire's perspective, we believe we have a responsibility to assist our volunteer fire fighters as much as we can and we hope that this facility will assist in achieving that objective.

## NAMING OF THE PRESTON BEACH ROAD CAUSEWAY

Following a request from the Preston Beach Progress Association, Council, have agreed to a proposal to name the Preston Beach Road Causeway in honour of the late Alf Barker. Alf, who was a Shire employee for over 30 years as Works Manager/Supervisor, was very much involved in the construction of many of the Shire roads we drive on today, including the Preston Beach Causeway. Alf was a very much loved and respected member of the Preston Beach community and, in fact was amongst the first to build there back in the early fifties. The Shire will be working with the Preston Beach community to organise an official dedication in the near future.

# CLOSURE OF UNNAMED ROAD RESERVES


Council recently received a request from the Department of Parks and Wildlife to consider a proposal to permanently close roads 228 and 13736 in order to facilitate the inclusion of this land into the Yalgorup National Park. Following discussion, Council resolved to advise DPAW and the City of Mandurah that it does not support the proposed closure as it will comprise the potential for the establishment of formalised secondary access to and from Preston Beach for emergency purposes. Road 228 traverses through both the Shire of Waroona and the City of Mandurah and whilst it currently is unconstructed and not identified for construction in the short term, a closure would impede the possibility of having this turned into an emergency access road if required.

The Shire of Waroona recently hosted a meeting of the P.D.C. at our council chambers and at this meeting the Shire C.E.O., Ian Curley and myself were invited to make a presentation to the board relevant to our Shire. We took this opportunity to highlight some of our aspirations for the future and to also reflect on some of the issues that have confronted us in the past 12 months and especially those that we are still grappling with at the present time.

The community of Preston Beach were saddened by the recent unexpected passing of Geoff "Bubbles" Stacey, aged 58. Geoff had a passion in caring for the pristine section of coast we have in our Shire at Preston Beach and rather than just talk about it, he set out on a path of positive action. He Invested in a tractor, fitted it out with a front end loader and embarked on a journey of stabilising our sand dunes. For many years, locals and visitors would witness this big, blue tractor slowly wending its way along the beach with a load of dune brushing from the green waste area at the car park to be eventually deposited in an area Geoff had identified as an area requiring attention. Geoff had no tolerance of those who thought it was okay to drive into the dunes and if he saw someone driving into the dunes then he would, with the help of his big, blue tractor make sure it was a darn sight harder to get back out the way they went in! In addition to the above Geoff worked closely with the Preston Beach Volunteer Ranger group and was always willing to help out in any way, whenever required and always with a big smile. 
