Alcoa Waroona Sustainability Fund Grants Awarded

The Alcoa Waroona Sustainability Fund (AWSF) has recently approved \$310,000 in funding to 8 community organisations. A total of 24 applications were received for this 3rd round of AWSF funding.

Grants have been awarded to:

- Waroona Bowling & Social Club \$30,000 towards improved lighting on the B green and new bar shutters;
- Shire of Waroona \$40,000 towards new playground equipment at Centennial and other parks;
- Waroona Community Men's Shed \$20,000 towards installation of solar panels on their new shed;
- Shire of Waroona \$50,000 towards developing a new youth precinct area in Waroona;
- Waroona West Volunteer Bushfire Brigade \$50,000 towards site works for their new fire station;
- Waroona Community Lights Committee \$30,000 towards more Christmas lights around town in 2019;
- Quambie Park Inc. \$40,000 towards solar panels on their new residential units in Millar St;
- Waroona Agricultural Society \$50,000 towards extensions of their clubrooms.

The operation of the fund is managed by an advisory committee which comprises of 2 Shire Councillors, 2 Alcoa representatives and 2 members of the public.

On Tuesday 9 July, Waroona celebrated Aboriginal culture with a showcase of activities, food and performances at the Waroona Memorial Hall. The event opened with a Welcome to Country from local elder Mr Rob Jetta. The crowd was then treated to a dance and didgeridoo performance by dancing group 'Bibbulmun Koorda'. Councillor Walmsley talked about how he loved hearing Aboriginal stories and encouraged the continued sharing of stories and culture.

This year's NAIDOC theme is "Voice, Treaty, Truth - lets work together for a shared future". The three key elements of the theme originate from the reforms set out in the Uluru Statement from the Heart. These reforms represent the unified position of First Nations Australians. Waroona can be proud of the NAIDOC showcase bringing us together.

Attendees were able to enjoy the activities and interact with the number of information and health promotion stalls including Earbus Foundation of WA, Family Support Service, CAMHS, Noongar Playgroup, Parenting Connection WA, Anglicare, Wanslea, Peel Jobs & Skills Centre, and the South West Aboriginal Medical Service. Stacey Francis from Perth Fever Netball was a popular guest; the Leos Club of Waroona provided a free sausage sizzle; the Waroona Youth Advisory Committee provided


face painting while the local Aboriginal community offered freshly made kangaroo

Over 200 people supported the event, with adults and children alike enjoying a day of free activities including rock painting, arts and crafts, colouring in, and taking on the climbing wall.
