Solar Heating

We recently hosted a visit by South West MLC Colin Holt who presented us with a cheque for \$16,597 for the upgrade of the solar heating unit at our popular indoor pool. Following the presentation Mr Holt was taken on a tour of the Waroona Recreation and Aquatic Centre and complemented the Shire and the community for providing such a wonderful facility.

Preston Beach Townsite Steering Committee Saturday 19th May, the Preston Beach Townsite

Committee hosted a community Steering workshop at the Lake Clifton community centre in order to outline for example, Townsite vision and objectives, conservation and environmental strategies as well as Masterplan proposals. From the Shires perspective we were delighted to see approximately 80 people attend this meeting as we firmly believe that it is important that the community of Preston Beach and the surrounding areas have every chance to not only hear what is being proposed but also have a voice in the matter. It would be fair to say that the workshop ensured that there were plenty of lively discussions with numerous points of view expressed by the participants. We look forward to seeing the outcome of this meeting.

FRAGYLE

On Tuesday 22nd May, the environmental group, FRAGYLE, provided an interesting presentation to Council and Senior staff members. They outlined their concerns regarding the potential detrimental impact that could happen if development was to occur in the areas north and south of Preston Beach.

May Council Meeting

At the last Council meeting it was agreed to adopt a new Local Planning Policy that will guide the construction of outbuildings within the Shire of Waroona. This new policy will seek to ensure that outbuildings are constructed to a high quality and design, are suitably sized for their location, appropriately sited and used so that they do not adversely impact on the amenity of the surrounding area.

Council also agreed to purchase a new All-Terrain Vehicle to be used by the Preston Beach Volunteer Rangers. This vehicle will complement the current 4WD that is currently being used by the beach rangers and with excellent ground clearance and agility will no doubt prove to be a marvellous asset for the Rangers ensuring quick response times can be achieved safely.

Successful Preston Beach Community Workshop

Over 80 residents and landowners from Preston Beach made the trip to the Lake Clifton Herron Community Centre on Saturday 19 May to participate in the Preston Beach Townsite Strategy Community Workshop. After a short welcome and introduction by the Shire President, Noel Dew and the Shire of Waroona Manager Planning Services, Louis Fouché, the conceptual vision for the future development of Preston Beach was presented by Malcolm Smith, representing the developers.

Malcolm is a London based, leading sustainability and town centre design expert who had been brought in by the land developer Acuitus to complement the local team. His presentation showed how the settlement of Preston Beach might grow over the next 20 -30 years from the current 400 lots to a town of 3,900 homes.

The proposal he presented for development would reinforce and link to the existing town, growing, over the next 5-15 years to the south, providing infrastructure, water, sewerage, broadband, and facilities for families including a school and areas to play. Development to the north of the townsite would follow in 15-20 years. Health and community services would enable residents to age in the community and a new community centre, caravan park and improved beach front would provide amenity. Buffers and protection for at-risk habitats and foreshore and National Park management services would protect and enhance the environment. Most jobs in the

town would initially be home based, with employment opportunities in construction, retail, service, health, education, tourism and conservation being created as the town grows.

Following on from the presentation the community worked in groups to assess the proposal in more detail. The consultants presented technical information and discussed ideas on the topics of environment, community services, infrastructure, landscaping, development staging and built form. Community members commented that they were pleased with the level of information provided at the workshop and the opportunity to again participate in the town planning process. Over the next few months the consultant team assisted by the Steering Committee will be working to refine and develop the draft Preston Beach Townsite Strategy. Your feedback on the proposal will assist this process. Once completed the Strategy will be presented to the Shire of Waroona Council for consideration to advertise and this process will also involve additional opportunities for community to provide formal comment.

Combustion Heaters and Smoke Nuisance

Although woodburning heaters are popular means of home heating, they can cause unnecessary pollution, create environmental nuisance for your neighbours and waste your money through unburnt fuel if they are used inefficiently. Remember important tips-

- Use dry fuel and seasoned timber which maximises heat release during combustion
- Make sure the fire is burning brightly so that there is enough heat for complete combustion
- Balance the of air and hot combustion gases to promote complete burning
- Allow enough time for complete burning of all the fuel.

If there is a lack of any or all of the above factors, your fuel will not burn completely. more pollutants will be released and you may cause unnecessary angst between your

Town Planning and Development Policy

Town Planning Scheme No. 7 (1996)

Notice is hereby given that the Shire of Waroona has resolved to adopt the Shire of Waroona Local Planning Policy for 25.0 – Outbuildings.

25.0 Outbuildings Policy.

The purpose of the Outbuildings policy is to achieve a balance between providing for the legitimate garaging, storage and other domestic needs of residents and to minimise the adverse impacts that outbuildings may have on the amenity, appearance and character of neighbourhoods and on neighbours.

- The objectives of the policy are:

 a) To provide a clear definition of what constitutes an "outbuilding".

 b) To ensure that the siting, design and scale of outbuildings are site responsive and respect the character of an area.

- To encourage the use of outbuilding materials and colours that compliments the landscape and amenity of the surrounding
- To ensure there is a relationship between the scale of the dwelling and the scale of the outbuilding.
- To provide a process for approving outbuildings that require Planning Consent in terms of the provisions of the Town Planning Scheme

The Policy has been adopted as a formal Planning Policy pursuant to Clause 2.4 of the Shire of Waroona Town Planning Scheme No. 7.

Excellent school partnership

wonderful collaboration between St Joseph's Primary School and local organisations will see the schools senior students bringing QR Codes to places of interest within the Shire. A QR (quick response) code is a two-dimensional code consisting of square dots arranged in a square pattern on a white background. When used in conjunction with a smartphone, the Waroona QR codes will take users to dedicated webpages created by the students. These pages will be filled with history, photos, interesting information and anecdotes.

"The innovation allows the children to achieve the new Australian National Curriculum outcomes of working with primary historical evidence in their local context," said Principal Matthew Faulkner. "This is coupled with the children advancing their use of information and communications technology (ICT) through the use of iPads, QR codes and webpages. In essence the children will research an historical or cultural place of interest in the Shire and create a webpage for visitors to access through the use of a QR code at the point of interest. The web access can provide dynamic information for visitors as long as they have a smartphone with them."

Tracy Manager Goldsworthy Manager Tracy Goldsworthy welcomed the students to the Visitor Centre in May to discuss research ideas. "The students have chosen subject sites rich in history and culture and I'm really looking forward to watching the project progress. Not only will this initiative provide them with a much stronger connection to the significance of points of interest within the Shire, it will give a fresh and youthful perspective to those who use the QR codes when visiting our area.
