New local planning policy

The Shire of Waroona has adopted a new Local Planning Policy 27.0 - Waroona Fast Hills Development for advertising purposes. Council has prepared this policy in response to increased development pressure in the Waroona

The intent of the policy is to preserve the high level of natural amenity that exists within the policy area by setting out coordinated approach subdivision and development planning. In order to achieve this policy identifies key road linkages, land provisions and development guidelines facilitate the development of the area in a sustainable manner.

coordinated responsible approach to future development in the hills area is needed to ensure that development occurs in a proper and orderly manner and best practice fire safety and access outcomes are delivered.

policy area is bounded by the Waroona townsite to the west. Nanga Brook Road to

the North, State Forrest to the east and broad acre agricultural land to the south.

Earth Satellite Station Council have received

application for Planning that proposes the establishment of a telecommunications telecommunications facility (satellite earth station) to be built in the Wagerup area. This proposed facility will form part of the wider National Broadband Network that is currently being rolled out Australia wide. Specifically, this SES will form part of NBNCo's Long Term Satellite Service. The earth stations will connect to two satellites, which are planned to launch in 2015 and will except in 2015 and will assist in providing improved coverage for rural and remote areas across Australia. As this project is estimated to cost around \$12 cost around \$12 Million it automatically instance the Peel Joint Development Assessment Panel who will replace Council as the consent authority.
