PRESTON BEACH FIRE SHED.

On Saturday 6th July, the Shire of Waroona in conjunction with the Preston Volunteer Fire Beach Brigade welcomed a large group of guests to participate in the official opening of the new Preston Beach Fire Shed. DFES South West A/ Superintendent. We also had the pleasure of welcoming some of our past members including Brian Waller Alf Barker and Gerry Hancocks. I had the pleasure of inviting both Alf and Gerry, who were founding members, to join with Don Randall, Murray Cowper, Chris Arnol and myself to cut the ribbon and declare the building open. In addition to the official guests we were delighted to welcome representatives from

Brigades and also members of the local community. This excellent facility has been built with the future in mind and will also be home to the Preston Beach Volunteer Beach Ranger group.

PEEL MOSOUITO MANAGEMENT GROUP.

At our last Council Meeting, Council agreed to enter into a reviewed Peel Memorandum of Understanding at the request of the Department of Health. This Memorandum of Understanding takes the opportunity to formalise improved training and cross local government boundary staff cohesion within the Peel Region which were identified as areas that could be improved as the result of a peer review undertaken in 2011. Contiguous Local Authority Group Scheme and given the ability of mosquitoes to travel vast distances. coordinated approach is essential to providing the best results possible in each local government. In addition, due to the large areas of salt marsh mosquitoes breeding habitat a helicopter is required to undertake treatments and the proper coordination of treatment timings is necessary.

Council Budget 2013/14

The Shire of Waroona 2013/14 Budget was adopted by the Council on 15th of August 2013. This budget represents the first proposal under new guidelines associated with Strategic Planning. This involves the preparation of a 10 year "Long Term Financial Plan" supported by a 4 year Corporate Business Plan (which is essentially a four year budget).

It is this plan and the Council's Community Strategic Plan that determine the recently adopted budget. Other factors considered during preparation of the budget include:

1. The level of Royalties for Regions funding and the timing of such funding

- 2. Grant for one off capital works grants
- 3. Ongoing grants such as road works grants
- 4. Assets management requirements
- 5. User fees & charges

With limited resources and a diverse range of services to provide for community expectations, preparation of the budget continues to be a challenging task.

Full details of all expenditure, grant income etc., can be obtained from the Council office and/or further summarised information will be provided with rate notices and on the Councils website www.waroona. wa.gov.au.

Rates notices out soon

Shire of Waroona rate notices will start to arrive in letter boxes for approximately 2,700 properties commencing the week of the 26th August. The mail out is the initial rate run of the 2013/14 financial year with rate payments due by 2nd October 2013. Council continues to make it as convenient as possible to pay rates with a range of instalment and payment options available. Tip passes will be attached to the base of all notices where the ratepayer is paying a service fee for rubbish and recycling. Ratepayers who own a rural property with a dwelling will be required to collect their rural tip pass from the Shire of Waroona Administration Office.

In addition to your rate notice, your envelope will also contain an information booklet which will include all you need to know about your local shire. To assist in the rates process, please ensure your current mailing address is correct. Ratepayers who have not received their rate notice as a result of change of address (change of address is required in writing), will continue to be subject to debt recovery action for late payment of rates. It is your responsibility to contact us should you not receive your notice.

Should you be eligible for a pensioner/ senior rebate on your property please ensure your application is submitted as soon as possible. To be eligible for a 50% pension rebate you must hold a current pensioner concession card or a commonwealth seniors health card and a seniors card. To be eligible for a 25% senior rebate you must hold a current seniors card. To be eligible you must be the owner of the property and reside there as your permanent place of address as of the 1 July 2013. You may also apply for a rebate for your shire rates by calling the Water Corporation on 1300 659 951.

Cachers download the photos and coordinates from geocaching.com and then visit each spot, work out its corresponding photo, and follow some simple instructions to figure out the final cache coordinates. Then it's off to the final cache to confirm your find and once home, onto the website again to record your success.

Suppor Service News Family

Family Support Service is funded by Department for Communities and falls under the umbrella of Waroona Community Resource Centre, to provide a service which builds capacity in the Waroona and Harvey Shires to support families, individuals and the community.

We aim to help families and individuals to gain the skills, confidence and knowledge to effectively manage their own lives.

Our service is committed to families. communities and individuals in the Waroona and Harvey Shires in a manner that is appropriate and accessible to people from indigenous and culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds.

Families and individuals are helped to explore their own

solutions to problems, by linking them to community including support resources, network. Practical assistance is offered, links to emergency relief, informal counselling. advocating for you, information and referral to other services. Also development of personal networks, fun and educational programs, information about community resource/service and NILS (No interest loan).

The Family Support Service has been successful in gaining funding for outreach services to the Harvey Shire including offices at Yarloop, as well as maintaining services within the Waroona Shire. The service welcomes Savannah Kirkland as the new Family Support Service Officer working with Cheryl Wainwright who is the service's Senior

Family Support Service Officer. Savannah previously worked in an administrative role at the Yarloop Community Resource Centre and looks forward to her new role as the service continues to grow and expand.

Over the last 3 years the service has developed within the three areas of emergency relief, one on one support and programming, alongside networking with services to be present in Waroona.

The service starts in Yarloop on the 12th of August and in Harvey on the 13th of August. You can find the Service at the Waroona, Harvey and Yarloop Community Resource Centres.

KidSport continues in the Shire of Waroona!

The Shire of Waroona has successfully been delivering funding from the Department of Sport and Recreation through the KidSport initiative to eligible children in the region.

This program provides an opportunity for children to participate in community sport and recreation. Clubs must first register with the Shire of Waroona which then allows children to redeem vouchers with their chosen club for the nominated season. These vouchers are then reimbursed by the Shire of Waroona through the KidSport funding.

Eligible families must hold a Health Care or Pension Concession Card. What are the eligible criteria?

- Applicant must be aged 5-18 years.

 Parent / Guardian must have a Health Care Card or Pension Concession Card or be referred by a 'recognised' referral agent.

 Applicant's primary place of residence must be in the Shire of Waroona
- Applicants primary place of resources must be a close (exceptions may apply).

 It is preferred that applicants register with a club that is in the Shire of Waroona

- Funding will cover the cost of fees to join the nominated sport or recreation club (this may include other related costs as identified by the club.)

 Maximum of up to \$200 per child per calendar year.
- Fees are only for the nominated registered season.
- No retrospective fees will be paid.
- No limitation to applications per family as long as criteria is met.
