# **Preston Beach Volunteer Rangers**

has 17kms of coastline under its control at Preston Beach, bordering on the City of Mandurah to the north and the Shire of Harvey to the south.

Some 14 years ago the Council approved an application to trial the formation of Volunteer Ranger group. This trial proved very successful and the group is still in operation in 2014.

Primarily the role of the Volunteer Rangers is one of education, explaining to the rapidly increasing number of visitors and locals the importance of the need respect the fragile environment, the need to adhere to the rules in place and, importantly, the need to drive on the beach in a manner that will ensure this is a safe environment for all who wish to use the heach. especially the many children who use the beach in summer. All of this is undertaken under the guidance and support of our Shire Rangers and additional support from the Shire who provide information brochures for distribution.

Volunteer Rangers often assist the police for a variety of reasons such as implementing beach closures, monitoring boats that may be in trouble, alerting the

The Shire of Waroona Mandurah Water Police and have been requested at times to keep an eye out for missing persons. A significant amount of time is also spent assisting and advising inexperienced four wheel drivers on the beach who find themselves in trouble and at times can be quite distressed.

Volunteer Rangers assist in the protection and care of sick or injured wildlife found on beach, working with the relevant wildlife agencies and assist with the regular dune brushing.

Volunteer Rangers pick up litter and sometimes after a severe storm this

can amount to several ute loads of an amazing array of timber, fuel/oil drums, bottles and the list goes on.

The Volunteer Rangers are a group of dedicated locals who can respond rapidly to any issue that may occur on Preston Beach and provide a valuable service to, not only the local community, but to the many visitors to the Preston Beach area during the popular summer months

The Volunteer Rangers have recently purchased an updated utility to be used alongside of their previously purchased ATV.
