DOG REGISTRATION RENEWALS

Dog Registration Renewals have now been sent out and must be paid by the 31st October 2014.

Under the provisions of the Dog Act, all dogs within the Shire over the age of 3 months must be registered. Registrations are carried out at the Shire office and are available for lifetime registrations or 1 and 3 year periods, commencing on the 1st November each year.

To obtain a concession rate on registrations for sterilised dogs, a sterilisation certificate must be produced when registering. In lowestites the maximum number of dogs is 2 must be produced when registering. In townsites the maximum number of dogs is a and rural areas the maximum number of dogs if 4. All dogs must be registered.

HESSE STREET RECONSTRUCTION

As part of the 2014/15 Road Construction Program Council is planning to carry out works on Hesse Street from Thatcher Street to Hair Street in the Waroona town site. Funding for the Hesse Street reconstruction has been received from the Royalties for Regions' Country Local Government Fund program.

Plans are currently being finalised and Council

expects that works will commence in October. The works on Hesse Street will include the reconstruction of some sections of the street, installation of subsoil drainage, and renewal of kerbing. Disturbance to crossovers in the affected area will be reinstated by Council. The existing eucalypt trees in the section from Thatcher Street to Neil Place will be removed.

These will be replaced with more appropriate street trees

It is also expected that there will be some interruptions while the reconstruction is taking place however access to affected properties will be maintained.

Plans can be viewed at the Shire of Waroona Depot 64 Thatcher Street, Waroona between 7am - 3pm Monday to Friday.

GRANT FUNDS AWARDED BY THE ALCOA WAROONA SUSTAINABILITY FUND COMMITTEE

In October 2013 the Alcoa Waroona Sustainability Fund Committee was formed to oversee the Alcoa Waroona Sustainability Fund (AWSF) and the Wagerup Sustainability Fund (WSF). The AWSF has a current balance of \$881,000 and the WSF had a balance of \$839,000 before grants were awarded.

In early 2014 the Committee announced the first grant funding round from the Wagerup Sustain-

awarded, in early 2014 the Committee announced the first grant funding round from the Wagerup Suslainability Fund, Prior to funds being allocated approval was required from The Trust Company, the company who administer the tax requirements of the fund.

I am pleased to advise that the following grants have met with final approval and have been funded: \$4,160 to the Girl Guides Waroona for training and minor building improvements.
\$13,900 to the Lake Clifton Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade for earthworks required for a new shed to house their fire truck.

\$6.600 to the Waroona Community Resource Centre to undertake a feasibility study for proposed

extensions to the current centre, \$15,000 to the Waroona Anglican Opportunity Shop for shop fittings for their new shop in Fouracre

\$5,830 to the Waroona Men's Shed to assist with their planning of a shed for Waroona. \$79,417 to Wargona Lions Club for extensions to the John Marchetti Shed and storage shed at the

showgrounds.

\$200,000 over 2 years, to Quambie Park Waroona to assist with the upgrading of residents rooms.

KEEPING ROOSTERS... NOT ALLOWED!!

The Shire of Waroona has received several complaints in the last few weeks regarding roosters being kept within the Waroona townsite.

Residents are reminded that Section 5.4.4 (1) of the Shire of Wa roona Health Local Laws states;

"An occupier of premises within a lownsite shall not without the written approval of the local government, keep or permit to be kept on those premises, any one or more of the following fowl.

(a) a rooster;

(b) a goose or gander:

(c) a turkey; (d) a peacock or peahen;

(e) a gamebird (includes emus and ostriches)....*



If you have any of the above fowl on your property, you are committing an offense and may be liable to a penalty of between \$100 (for a first offence) and \$500, with additional penalties applying if you choose not to remove the animal when requested by the Shire.
