MOSQUITO CONTROL

Spring brings longer, warmer days and provides ideal conditions for The WA Department of Health has recently issued a warning mosquitoes to breed and migrate far from breeding grounds. Spring also sees an increase in the time we spend outdoors which means we need to become "mosquito aware and prepare" to avoid mosquito bites and mosquito borne viruses.

What can you do?



much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bite through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also appropriately covered up.

Repel - Use insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltoluamide) picaridin or Oil of Lemon Eucalyptus (OLE), also known as PMD, and have been made since the beginning of 2020. The full warning always follow the instructions on the label.


Clean up - Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your website: home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from containers.

LEGIONNAIRES' DISEASE WARNING

about Legionnaires Disease. This bacterial disease is a severe, and potentially fatal, form of pneumonia contracted by breathing in dust from soil products contaminated by legionella bacteria. The gardening products which commonly contain legionella bacteria include bagged potting mix, mulch and compost. Another strain of the bacteria can also contaminate water in air conditioning cooling towers, whirlpool spas, Cover up - Wear long, loose-fitting, light-coloured clothing, covering as fountains, misting systems and shower heads (which may include safety shower and evewash facilities).
