As one of the inaugural members of the Waroona Roadwise Group I am somewhat angered by a recent announcement that the State Government intends to significantly cut the funding to this long established and respected road wise

program that operates

can't help but feel that decision demeans the efforts of so many hard working local government Roadwise groups who have worked diligently for many years in order to get the message out to keep our communities aware and our roads safe. The funding to the Roadwise Program will be cut by around \$1.8million with the result that many road safety programs to local communities will suffer, community grants eliminated and staffing reduced. I strongly believe that community efforts that work to reduce the terrible carnage on our roads needs to be supported NOT diluted. I recently attended a meeting of Peel Zone which includes the City of Mandurah, Shires of Boddington,

across this state.

Миггау, Serpentine-Jarrahdale and Waroona, and as a group unanimous were our opposition to this decision.

Asset Management Plans

Council recently adopted Asset Management "Drainage", Plans for "Footpaths/Cycleways" and "Parks and Other Infrastructure". The Management Plans adopted are a culmination of approx. 20 months of research data gathering. These plans will assist in ensuring assets are used, maintained, and improved, as efficiently as possible to support the Councils' Community Strategic Plan, and to ensure compliance with statutory regulations.

Mobile Sign Trailer

The Shire has recently

received funding \$20,000 to enable the purchase of a new mobile sign trailer with an estimated value of \$32,000.

Preston Reach

Recent wild weather, particularly strong winds and a large swell, resulted in waves flooding up to the sand dunes and also the access tracks. Volunteer Rangers were kept busy advising visitors to this area of the potential danger of driving on the beach during these conditions. Sadly a large whale was washed ashore sometime during Saturday night. Holt's Food Run a vital boost for Foodbank

SUPPLIES at the Bunbury Foodbank received a much-needed boost last week when South West MLC Colin Holt hit the road to collect food donation bins in Waroona, Harvey and Brunswick.

It is the fourth year of the Food-

bank Food Run and in the previous three years more than seven tonnes of food were collected for South West Foodbank branches.

Foodbank WA is the pantry for the welfare sector and in partnership with more than 1200 agencies. it delivers hunger relief to people

It also operates the Schools

Breakfast Program, which provides a healthy breakfast to more than 15,000 students every week.
On the road from Mandurah to

Albany, Mr Holt delivered the col-lected donations to the Foodbanks in Peel, Bunbury and Albany. "We always get a good response


in small towns such as Waroona, Harvey and Brunswick, where we work with IGA and other supermarkets," he said.

Officer puts in big effort to help leave a Legacy

BLISTERS on his feet and sore muscles were a small price to pay for Harvey Police Constable Kevin Francis when he returned from last month's WA Police Legacy Karratha to Broome Marathon.

Police officers, teachers and miners, mainly from the Pilbara, made up two teams which pedalled the 800km in 30 hours, taking turns to complete the distance.

The event added about \$40,000 to

WA Police Legacy funds to provide financial help for children of police officers killed on duty.

Each participant raised a mini-

mum of \$500 and Const. Francis rode his stationary exercise bicycle for eight hours non-stop in July outside Parton's IGA in Harvey to raise awareness and money for the

Const. Francis rode 455km of the distance from Karratha to Broome and then used his artistic skills to paint an artwork of the ride which was auctioned for \$455 at a final

barbecue fundraiser in Broome. He said the 2013 bike marathon was also a memorial ride in honour of Karratha Senior Sergeant Tony "Cruise" Gaskell, who had been a driving force behind the ride for many years but died just three weeks before this year's

event.
"This is the 20th year of the annual ride which has raised about \$100,000 in the last three years, Const. Francis said.

"We all had blisters on our feet and sore backsides but it only made us stronger.

"The support of the Harvey community at our fundraising day in July was fantastic and the support inspired me to ride such a long dis-

"With the community support I raised \$7000 and I am keen to participate again next year, hopefully with Sgt Laurie Morley."




Sea to Art entries closing soon
